BROME AND OAKLEY

Brome and Oakley are rural villages in north Suffolk. They are physically separate ribbon settlements, bounded by the Eye Airfield industrial development and the busy A140 trunk road on the western margin of Brome, and with the B1118 designated lorry route running through Lower Oakley. Traffic speed and safety are therefore significant concerns of many parishioners, as is the protection of the natural environment and the villages' rural character.

Local Issues raised:

- Improvement needed on junctions with the A140 to make them safer for turning traffic.
- Rat-running on minor roads
- Impact of planned growth at Eye Airfield and in Eye
- Proportionate housing growth
- Provision of better public transport links to sustain employment opportunities in rural locations
