

Funding success for DYCC Futures project

Diss Town Council has been successful in being awarded a UK SPF Pride in Place Community Grant, which will cover the costs



of a feasibility study to determine the future of the Diss Youth & Community Centre. We have appointed FMG Consulting Ltd to undertake the study, which will consider several options, determine the likely demand for community facilities, engage with stakeholders and provide projected levels of income and operating costs to ensure best value for the community. The Town Council will continue to work alongside South Norfolk District Council who have been supportive of the process and the outcomes of the study should be known before the end of the year.



Diss Library Celebrating 60 Years

In March this year, the current Diss Library building reached its 60th anniversary.

The present Diss Library, in Church Street was opened on the 17th March 1964.
Costing £10,000, the building replaced the reading room and library that had been housed for many years in the Corn Hall.
Diss had been well served by the library service for many years. From as early as 1780, the town had a circulating library that was established at about the same time as the Norfolk and Norwich Library in Norwich. By 1885 a reading room was established at the newly built Corn Hall and that room had remained connected to the library facilities.


In 1962, after concerns about accessibility of the library in the Corn Hall and with plans for the modernisation and redevelopment of large areas of the town, a bylaw approval was given by the council for the demolition of the bakery premises and adjoining properties in Church Street and building of the new library facilities for the town started at the end of 1963

For the past six decades, the library has put itself at the heart of the community in Diss, providing access to books and learning, running many events and exhibitions over the years and providing a safe warm space for everyone to enjoy.

Currently the library has a number of groups including Bounce and Rhyme sessions and story times for under 5s, lego club, reading groups, Just a Cuppa meet up Fridays, plus volunteers offering computer advice and 1:1 sessions supporting adults with reading. A number of health and wellbeing services are also available, Tricky Period sanitary items and toiletry bags are amongst the items available free of charge.

The library is planning to hold a 60th anniversary celebration in the new year and would welcome any memories that you may have of using the library service in Diss over the past 60 years to share as part of the celebration.

Everyone had a lovely evening in the everpleasant surrounds of James and Lynn Kay's gorgeous garden and they raised over £2000 for Rotary charities.





Diss URC is located on Mere Street, opposite Aldi and next door to the new Post Office. They run several regular community groups:

- The Dove Dementia Cafe and Dove Song (music therapy) for people with a Dementia diagnosis and their carers
- Dove Song Plus (music therapy) for adults with complex needs
- Dovelets (music therapy, messy and sensory play) for children aged 0-5 and their parents/carers
- The Welcome Cafe (every Friday 9.30-12) which is open to everyone

They also have one faith based group, Dove Afternoon Tea, for anyone who enjoys chatting, singing hymns and hearing passages from the Bible.

Diss and District Royal British Legion

This year, The Diss and District Branch Royal British Legion will celebrate its Century.



The Early Years

The Royal British Legion, originally called the British Legion, was formed in 1921.

It was created to unite various groups of men who had served in the Great War such as the NADSS, the National Association of Discharged Sailors and Solders, which was formed in Blackburn in 1917.

The first Diss Branch of the British Legion was also formed in 1921.

The National Federation of Discharged Seamen and Demobilized Soldiers formed a branch in Diss soon after the Federation was created.

In 1921 it was decided to become a part of the newly formed British Legion, which was not Allied to any Political Organisation. The Diss British Legion Branch opened on the 22nd August 1921, but sadly it was short lived.

From the Diss Express 26th Sept 1923

Closing of the Diss British Legion Branch "Sadly it has been announced that the Diss Branch of the British Legion has been wound up.

Great Credit has to be given to Mr Murray, the Organising Secretary who has mainly kept the Branch going for a long time.

There appears to be a great lack of interest in the movements on the part of those it was intended to serve.

The Contributions has not equalled the expense involved in running the Branch.

There will be a meeting at St Marys Church Hall on Saturday November 29th with a view to re-establishing a British Legion Branch in Diss."

The Diss and District Branch was first established in 1924 and, 100 years later, is still operating.

Anyone of any age and ability is welcome, and we can also provide Duke of Edinburgh Award volunteering experience!

Remembrance Parade and Sunday Service 2024



Diss Town Council and the Royal British Legion warmly invite the public to take part in this year's Remembrance Sunday parade, wreath-laying ceremony and church service to honour our fallen heroes.

The parade will commence as usual from Mere's Mouth at approximately 2.15pm on Sunday 10th November and to accommodate larger crowds and involve younger participants, this year's wreathlaying ceremony will take place on the Market Place.

The procession usually attracts over 35 different organisations including the Salvation Army Band, standard and flag bearers, the Royal British Legion, members of the armed forces, air and army cadets, emergency services, youth groups and

various charities.

A short 'drumhead' service will be held in the Market Place following which representatives of local organisations will be invited to lay their wreath at the drumhead alter. After the ceremony, all are invited to St Mary's Church for a special remembrance service, beginning at 3pm. During this time the wreaths will be moved from the Market Place to the war memorial where this event will conclude with a short dedication gathering after the church service.

The Drumhead Service originated in the 1700's when soldiers about to go into battle required a place for reflection for the difficult times ahead. It was also used 'post battle' as a place of remembrance for their fallen comrades. It allows the regimental padre to hold a church service 'in the field'

and they use the regimental drums, neatly piled and draped in the appropriate colours (e.g. national or regimental flags) to create a platform on which a Bible and other equipment could be placed to allow them to conduct a formal service. The Padre leads an ecumenical service and to this day remains in use.

Remembrance events are organised by a committee led by Diss Town Council, with representatives from the Diss branches of the Royal British Legion, Salvation Army, army and air cadets, RAFA and St Mary's Church.

Town Clerk, Sarah Villafuerte-Richards encourages the public to attend the parade, wreath-laying ceremony and church service, saying, "We invite everyone to join us in honouring the sacrifices made by our service men and women to protect our freedom."



For safety, a temporary road closure will be in effect on Sunday 10th November, from 2pm to 3.30pm for the Remembrance Parade. This will impact Mere Street, Market Place, St Nicholas Street, Mount Street (from



Saracens Head to Market Place), and Market Hill in Diss.

Additionally, a minute's silence will be observed in the Market Place on Monday 11th November, at 11am. Please join us in these important tributes to commemorate the service and sacrifices of our Armed Forces community.

Diss Town Council has signed the Armed Forces Covenant and recognises the value Serving Personnel, both Regular and Reservists, Veterans and military families contribute to our business and our country. To find out more visit

The Diss Community Woodland Project: Quaker Wood and the Green Gap!

If you have visited Quaker Wood recently, you will have seen how far our site has come as a habitat for wildlife, since its original planting in 2011. What was once a scene of planted trees on old grazing land is now a dense canopy, with paths running through it leading to both our Wildlife Pond and Wildflower Meadow. You will see signs of wildlife everywhere, in our hedgerows, trees, bird boxes and bat boxes. The site has truly come into its own, relying on our team of dedicated volunteers to keep it accessible to people and beneficial to nature.



A new understanding of biodiversity is developing however, insisting that in order for UK wildlife to survive and to thrive, lone habitats in isolation of each other are not enough. What we all now need to work towards is greater habitat connectivity, through the creation of Green Corridors and new smaller habitats to link the larger habitats together.



A major step to achieving this in Diss was the passing of the Diss and District Neighbourhood Plan by referendum in September 2023. One policy of the Neighbourhood Plan is the creation of the 'Green Gap', a space allocated between Diss and Roydon where development is not permitted and the creation of Green corridors and open green space is encouraged.

Having successfully established Quaker Wood as a wildlife site open to all, the 'Diss Community Woodland Project' now wish to explore opportunities in the Green Gap to help create a habitat network linking Quaker Wood to other sites.



Diss Gazeteer of 1938

The 1938 Diss Gazeteer & Directory was in its 84th year of publication, since 1854.

The front and back advertisements are for Bale's groceries and Doubles' tobacconist, both shops that were still active in living memory.

The telephone exchange was then at 68 Mount Street. As few people were on the phone, Easto's fish shop was Diss 14. Calls could be made from kiosks at Victoria Road and Denmark Green.

The town had a Choral & Operatic Society and an Amateur Dramatic Club.

The Diss Junior Imperial League was typical of right-wing groups that sprang up in the inter-war years.

The Young Men's Friendly Society met in the Victoria Hall at the north-east corner of the churchyard.

In case of fire, application should be made immediately to the Superintendent of the Brigade, Mr. George Rice, Chapel Street. Tel. Diss 81 (and hope that he was at home!) Frenze Road only went up to No. 25, which was a few houses beyond what is now the

Skelton Road turning. There are names of men who would die in the coming war. Donald Brundell, of 3 Church Street,

would lose his life in an air collision between an Anson and a Lysander. Richard Wells, whose father managed the National & Provincial Bank in Mere Street, died in a Liberator crash.

As Skelton Road had not been built, Mere Manor was considered as 7 Victoria Road. This was the address of Alan Conrad Coningsby-Gayford, late of New Scotland Yard. His gravestone is in the Heywood Road cemetery. He sounds like a detective ('Coningsby-Gayford of The Yard'); but was just a Civil Servant.

Almanacs had common pages; so there are Dickens illustrations and quotes, helpful hints, words of wisdom and even a short story, An Idyll of the Moss Lands by Oswald Wildridge.





Firework and bonfire safety advice

Now that autumn is here, you might already be planning get-togethers with family and friends including Bonfire Night on 5th November.

And if you celebrate Diwali, your plans might be underway for 1st November.

To help reduce the risks of incidents and injuries in 2024, Norfolk Fire and Rescue Service and the county council's Trading Standards team are reminding residents about bonfire and firework safety.

The best place to enjoy Bonfire Night displays are at organised events which are the safest option.

But if you are having your own event at home for Bonfire Night you need to remember these tips to help reduce the risks of harm for everyone attending:

- · Build bonfires away from flammable materials such as fences, sheds and trees
- Use only dry and suitable materials for burning
- Don't light your bonfire with petrol
- Keep a hose or a bucket of water nearby.

If you are buying fireworks, it is really important you buy them from a reputable retailer, and not second-hand. Only buy



fireworks with a CE mark and make sure any selection boxes are sealed when you buy them. Also:

- · follow instructions on how to use the fireworks carefully
- never ever go back to a lit firework
- never throw fireworks
- · always supervise children around fireworks.

Remember not to give sparklers to children under 5, and ensure anyone using a sparkler wears gloves and puts the sparkler hot end down into a bucket of water or sand when it has burnt out.

Always call 999 in an emergency.

Painting the Town



Andriy Nekrasov is an Honoured Artist of Ukraine and member of the National Union of Artists of Ukraine.

Born on June 14,1962 into the family of a military man, Andriy spent his childhood in the Kyiv region surrounded by the amazing views of the blue Dnipro and golden meadows which made an unforgettable impression on the young man. Inspired to paint, Andriy studied in the workshops of Ukrainian artists Nartsis Kocherezhko and Vasyl Korchynskyi and quickly found his painting style, where the main focus is a sense of colour and a playful combination in the works. Working in oil and using a palette knife in large strokes, he paints still lifes, sea horizons, city and natural landscapes.

His creative work includes many Carpathian and Crimean landscapes and seacoasts, scenes of rapid mountain rivers, coastal views of Odessa and the ancient river Dnipro as well as studies of the architecture of Ukrainian and European cities.

Personal exhibitions have been widely held at the Ukrainian Culture Fund, the Cultural Center of the Ukrainian Society for the

Preservation of Historical and Cultural Monuments of Ukraine, the National Reserve "Sofia Kyivska", the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine, the Lviv Writers' Union of Ukraine, the Kyiv Central Officers' Building, the Government House and the Supreme Council of Ukraine.

Many of the artist's works are also held in private collections, both in Ukraine and abroad.

Today, Andriy Nekrasov works in Suffolk, painting the historic architecture of towns, amazing landscapes, seacoasts of the United Kingdom and London cityscapes.

Andriy has already had several solo exhibitions in London and at the beautiful Fullers Mill Garden (West Stow, Bury Saint Edmunds), where he has been an Artist in Residence for the past two years.


